

Parenting Evidence Review Scotland Published June 2024

Parenting Evidence Review 2024

- 28 qualitative research studies published in 2023
- 4000+ parent participants
- At least 26 /32 local authorities represented
- single parents, black and minority ethnic parents, disabled parents and parents with disabled children, refugees and parents seeking asylum, carers, care experienced parents, parent of children in the care system and adoptive parents.
- Key themes include poverty, mental health and physical health, education and childcare

Evidence Review - Poverty



"People are being forced to choose between feeding their children or paying the rent." (parent)

"Universal Credit is too unpredictable to rely on and does not provide for basic day-to-day costs. I live rurally and rely on local, more expensive food shops... I am spending three times what the cost would be in the city" (parent)

"Our house has dampness and the landlord gave us a dehumidifier which cost a lot to run, and it is really bad in the winter. So I have to move my daughter out her room as this is the worst room in the house, and myself

Evidence Review - Health



"I want Stevie to be able to go to something he wants to go to. You know, I want them to go to help at the theatre or ... cinema ... you know, as a volunteer ... something that he wants to do." (parent)

"Parent and carers reported having to take on an increasing role in advocating for, and coordinating, their children's support. Transitioning to adulthood also led to the emergence of issues which hadn't been seen during childhood." (service)

"Don't only listen but hear us also." (parent)

Evidence Review - Education



"We cannot currently afford any extra childcare costs; I have had to decline extra working hours because childcare would not be covered by the extra pay" (parent)

Working from home with flexi time ... allows me to get the boys out to school and be here for them coming home. I feel I'm getting to see my boys grow up which I don't feel my dad did." (parent)

"whenever I want to ask about my son's behaviour daily, I do not know how [to ask in English], so I just walk away [literal translation: carry myself and walk away] without telling them." (parent)

- Doing justice to what parents and carers tell us

Who we are

- Established in 1956 by a group of pioneer parents who were passionate about parent involvement in their child's learning but felt that they needed a voice at national as well as local level.
- Parentkind exists to: Empower all with parental or educational responsibility to improve the life chances of children, young people and their communities.



What we do

- We give those with a parenting role a voice in education. We invest substantial resources in representing parent views on their child's learning to government, charities, unions and other organisations.
- Parentkind is the network of PTA fundraisers in the UK. We bring specialist fundraising support and advice to parent volunteers so that every school can benefit from a successful PTA.
- Our schools programme includes parental engagement training and our 'Blueprint for Parent-Friendly Schools'.



Our work around parent voice

- We are evidence-led; we have undertaken research amongst parents on a range of issues related to education for a number of years.
- Flagship piece of research is our National Parent Survey formally our Annual Parent Survey. Includes topics such as parental participation, accountability, mental health, curriculum, cost of living and others.
- Undertake other ad hoc surveys with parents on a wide range of topics including financial education, RSE, assessment, tutoring, smartphones, school attendance, and behaviour.
- Parentkind supported and contributed to the All-Party Parliamentary Group (APPG)
 for Parental Participation in Education which met regularly to hear evidence and
 discuss solutions to the barriers for parents involvement and engagement in school
 life and education. Currently establishing a new APPG for Parents.

Current work – research & policy

- Regular meetings with Department for Education, Ofsted, Ofqual, NEU, NAHT,
 Chartered College of Teaching
- Recent involvement in Ofsted's The Big Listen and DfE's review of Curriculum
 & Assessment
- 'Dear Secretary of State' Parentkind's 6 point plan for parents:
 - 1. Don't be afraid to say children should enjoy school.
 - 2. Commit to listening to parents when decisions are made.
 - 3. The cost of school must be part of a national approach to poverty.
 - 4. Support new Parent Teacher Associations (PTAs) in our poorest areas.
 - 5. Ofsted needs to report back on parent engagement.
 - 6. Announce a National Parent Participation Strategy.

National Parent Survey 2024

- Parents' biggest challenges:
 - Pressures on parents' time
 - Being a good parent and raising well-rounded children
 - Financial pressures
 - Health, happiness and safety of children (and sometimes parents)
 - Children's screen time and access to social media
 - Children's experience at school

National Parent Survey 2024 - England

More than a quarter of parents are worried about affording their rent or mortgage

More than half of parents would like to spend more time doing learning activities as a family

22% of parents rate their mental health as poor or very poor

15% of parents say their child feels unsafe at school

More than half

of parents have or would consider their child missing school for a holiday

15% of parents say their child spends 7+ hours on screens on a typical weekday







 Understanding the school curriculum and system • Accessing help for children with ALN and SEN • Accessing mental health support for children experiencing anxiety




Parent Poverty Survey



522 Parents and carers shared their views this represented 1084 children



94% of respondents feel that parents/carers are worrying about being about to afford necessities.





Impact of Poverty

Family Life 'With our busy schedules, there's little time for family bonding.'

Working families 'Poverty isn't just hitting low-income families, working families who receive little financial support in terms of benefits are also struggling.'

Life as a parent 'I feel ashamed that I can't provide for my child as I would like to, I feel that I have failed my children'

Poverty Stigma 'I don't want to ask for help...it is a matter of pride.... people look down on us because we are not able to provide. It makes me feel like less of a mum'

Hidden poverty of parents 'I find the money somehow even if it means having a basic meal instead of a full proper meal.'
